The Royal Horseguards	2 Whitehall Ct, London SW1A 2EJ	An impressive historic building in London, The Royal Horseguards Hotel is situated on the River Thames at Embankment, encompassing two iconic buildings - the National Liberal Club which has played host to historical icons including Churchill, Gladstone and Lloyd-George; and the club's magnificent apartments which were previously the home of the first chief of Britain's Secret Intelligence Service.
CitizenM Tower Bridge	40 Trinity Square, London EC3N 4DJ	Clean, slick and business style hotel.
Novotel London Tower Bridge	10 Pepys St, London EC3N 2NR	The hotel has excellent transportation links, close to many major tube stations such as Tower Hill, Monument and Bank, making it easy to get around London.
The Tower Hotel	St Katharine's Way, London E1W 1LD	Ideally located on the London Way next to Tower Bridge with views over the River Thames.
Waterloo Hub	54 Kennington Rd, London SE1 7BJ	The Waterloo Hub Hotel & Suites are equipped with everything the modern traveller requires.
Novotel - London Waterloo	113 Lambeth Rd, London SE1 7LS	Novotel London Waterloo Hotel is within walking distance of the Thames, Big Ben and Buckingham Palace. The hotel has excellent transportation links, close to many major tube stations such as Waterloo, Westminster, Vauxhall and Victoria. There is car parking on site.
Rubens At The Palace	39 Buckingham Palace Rd, London SW1W 0PS	Set in London's royal heart on Buckingham Palace Road, five minutes' walk from Victoria Station, The Rubens at the Palace is positioned in one of the most central locations to best take in all that the great British capital has to offer.
The Clermont	101 Buckingham Palace Rd, London SW1W 0SJ	Designed by James Thomas Knowles and opened in 1862 as The Grosvenor Hotel. Located adjacent to Victoria station and boasts links to the Circle, District and Victoria underground lines.
Hilton Doubletree	100 Cromwell Rd, South Kensington, London SW7 4ER	With the Gloucester Road subway station just across the road, our hotel is in a great location for exploring London. Located in the museum district, we are within a mile of Kensington Palace, Hyde Park, and the Natural History Museum. Knightsbridge luxury shops and eateries are just a mile away. Gordon's Wine Bar	47 Villiers St, London WC2N 6NE	The oldest wine bar in London almost says enough, one of the most revered spots to take in the history of the capital and have a glass. Gordon's is renowned for its history with a vaulted candlelit cellar and old oak barrels filled with sherries and port. With walls covered by old photographs, newspaper clippings of historic events you can take a step back in time. There is an excellent al fresco area too which is notably popular in the summer and can be hard to get a table after 4.00pm.
The Pavilion End	23 Watling St, London EC4M 9BR	Situated on the oldest Roman road in England, great location, good food, live sport, whats not to love.
The George	75 Borough High St, London SE1 1NH	Dating back to the 17th century, The George is the last surviving galleried inn in London and just a two-minute walk from Borough Market. The George is mentioned in the Charles Dickens novel Little Dorrit, with the author himself having visited the site of the pub when it was still a coffee house.
The Serpentine Café	Hyde Park, Serpentine Rd, London W2 2UH	The Serpentine Cafe in Hyde Park is a charming little café nestled beside the picturesque Serpentine Lake. The café has both indoor and outdoor seating, with a lovely terrace overlooking the water. The interior of the café is cozy and inviting, with large windows that allow plenty of natural light. Serving a range of light bites, hot drinks, and sweet treats, the café is the perfect spot for a quick snack or leisurely brunch.
The Punchbowl	41 Farm St, London W1J 5RP	The Punch Bowl is an historic pub in London dating back to around 1750. Over the years, the pub has undergone some alterations but still retains many period features. This pub gained fame with Madonna's 2004 documentary "I'm Going to Tell You a Secret," which showed her and her then husband, director Guy Ritchie, enjoying a night out in their 'local'. He bought the pub in February 2008 and as part of Ritchie and Madonna's divorce settlement in November 2008, Ritchie obtained full ownership of the pub. Located on Farm Street and named after the manor or "Farm", which existed in the area during the medieval times.
Ye Grapes Pub	16 Shepherd Market, London W1J 7QQ	Believed to have been established in the mid-18th century, Ye Grapes is one of the oldest surviving pubs in the area. Throughout its long history, The Grapes Pub has attracted a diverse range of clientele. In the 19th century, the pub became popular among artists, writers, and bohemians who frequented the Shepherd Market area. Notably, English author Charles Dickens is said to have been a regular visitor to The Grapes during his time living in Mayfair.
