Harry's Bar	5 Rue Daunou, 75002 Paris, France	<p>You might wonder why we don't take you up to the Paris Opera House and down this shabby little street, but it is home to the iconic Harry's Bar. Located at 5 Rue Daunou, 'New York Bar' was founded by American jockey Tod Sloan on November 24, 1911. The bar, originally entirely dismantled and transported from New York, was intended to cater to English-speaking expatriates in Paris and quickly became a popular expatriate spot during World War I. Sloan ran into debt and was forced to sell up to his barman, Harry MacElhone, when it became Harry's. He would be responsible for making it into a legendary Parisian landmark we see today.</p> <p>Hollywood stars, musicians, royalty, and literary icons have all frequented the bar, including Prince Serge Obolensky, Sinclair Lewis, Ernest Hemingway, Daft Punk, Coco Chanel, Jack Dempsey, Primo Carnera, Ramon Novarro, Rita Hayworth, and Humphrey Bogart, among others.</p> <p>In the 1960 Ian Fleming short story ""From a View to a Kill"", James Bond reminisces about his first visit to Paris at age 16, recalling how he followed the instructions in Harry's advertisement in the Continental Daily Mail and told his taxi driver ""Sank Roo Doe Noo"" to get to the bar. That night, he experienced one of the most memorable evenings of his life....!</p>
Les Deux Magots	6 Pl. Saint-Germain des Prés, 75006 Paris, France	A place at the crossroads of arts, Les Deux Magots is the stage of a great cultural theatre where great plays have been performed for 140 years. Nourished by the artistic aura of the Saint-Germain-des-Prés district, the Maison has welcomed the greatest names in literature, music, cinema and fashion : from the poet Paul Verlaine to the film director J.J. Abrams, and among others Ernest Hemingway, Simone de Beauvoir and Paul McCartney.
L'Etoile Vénitienne	20 Av. Kléber, 75016 Paris, France	Known for its cosy atmosphere and traditional French cuisine, situated at 20 Avenue Kléber, just a stone's throw away from the famous Arc de Triomphe.

Le Procope	13 Rue de l'Ancienne Comédie, 75006 Paris	<p>Le Procope, the oldest café in Paris, in the heart of Saint-Germain des Prés.</p> <p>A mythical restaurant in the 6th arrondissement of Paris since 1686, Le Procope is a place steeped in history where the greatest writers and intellectuals have gathered (Rousseau, Diderot, Verlaine...) in a historic decor.</p> <p>Le Procope offers a traditional and bourgeois French cuisine, through different specialties such as Coq au vin and Tête de veau, braised beef cheek, homemade Mille-feuille and traditional Procopio-style Tiramisù.</p>
Brasserie Lipp	151 Bd Saint-Germain, 75006 Paris, France	<p>On 27 October 1880, Léonard Lipp and his wife Pétronille opened the brasserie on the Boulevard Saint-Germain. Their speciality was a cervelat rémoulade starter, then choucroute garnie, served with the finest beers. The brasserie's atmosphere and its modest prices make it a great success.</p>
Le Relais de Venise L'Entrecôte	20 Rue Saint-Benoît, 75006 Paris, France	<p>World famous, Le Relais de Venise first opened in 1959, offering you the traditional French bistro meal of steak-frites as the only main dish. You receive our simple set menu of a walnut salad with mustard vinaigrette to start, followed by two servings of steak-frites with our famous house sauce.</p>
